GUIDELINES FOR CHOOSING RECIPIENT OF THE LIVE OAK AWARD

- 1. The person has not been President of the Federation and would not be expected to be elected to that job in the future.
- 2. The person has actively served on the RFGC Board for at least five years.
 - 3. The person has actively supported the work of the Federation for many years.
 - 4. In March a committee of all past presidents of the RFGC will be called to select the Live Oak winner.
- 5. The winner is to be kept secret and a special presentation made for Day in May.
